

# 2012 WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP SCHOOL BOARD ELECTION INFORMATION

The Metropolitan School District of Washington Township, Marion County is an urban/suburban school system located in Northern Marion County. It has an outstanding academic and vocational program and a record of success.

The governance for the system lies with the Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of Washington Township, five persons who are elected by township citizens.

You are urged to consider becoming a candidate for the Board of Education for the November 2012 election. The responsibilities of serving as a member of the Board are great, yet the rewards gained through helping to shape the future of this outstanding educational system are many. You may also know of others who should become candidates.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES & QUALITIES**

The Board of Education's foremost duty is to determine and set policy for the school district and to continually review and evaluate the effectiveness of that policy. Other matters of major importance include supervision of financial affairs, educational program needs, and key school personnel. Board of Education members must also keep abreast of state and local legislative affairs.

A person who seeks a School Board position should be dedicated to serving the community, sincerely interested in education, willing to hear other views, and committed to gaining information necessary for decisions on all matters that come before the Board. ### **ELIGIBILITY**

Each Board Member is elected to a four year term. To be eligible to seek election, a candidate must have been a resident of the Metropolitan School district of Washington Township for at least two years, as of June 30, 2012. A candidate must also be registered to vote in one of the three sub-districts as described below..


## THREE SUB-DISTRICTS

To ensure geographical representation, the five School Board Members are elected from three sub-districts (see map) within the Township. Each sub-district must have at least one but not more than two seats on the Board of Education. Further, to ensure some continuity, the terms of Board members are staggered. A group of two seats are selected at one election and a group of three seats are selected two years later.

There are three incumbent School Board Members whose terms expire in 2012, one from Sub-District I and two from Sub-District III. In November of 2012 we must elect three candidates. One new Board Member must be elected from Sub-District III. The other two Board Members may be elected from any of the Sub-Districts provided that no Sub-District is represented by more than two sitting Board members. Once elected, a School Board Member represents the entire Township, not just the sub-district from which she or he was elected.

#### MSDWT PARENT COUNCIL SLATING

Washington Township is strong in large part because of parental involvement throughout the District's 50+ year history. The MSDWT Parent Council is an alliance of parent advocates who act on their belief that quality public education is an investment in the future. As part of its mission to support Washington Township schools, the Parent Council interviews candidates for the Board of Education elections, and presents a slate it believes will best advance the interests of students, parents and the greater Washington Township community. **DISTRICT I BOUNDARY LINES:** Beginning at 86<sup>th</sup> St. and Township Line Rd. East on 86<sup>th</sup> to Harcourt Rd., South on Harcourt to 79<sup>th</sup> St., East on 79<sup>th</sup> to Spring Mill Rd., South on Spring Mill to 75<sup>th</sup> St., East on 75<sup>th</sup> to College Ave., South on College to 71<sup>st</sup>, West on 71<sup>st</sup> to Central Ave., South on Central to Washington Blvd., Northwest on Washington Blvd. to 71<sup>st</sup> St., West on 71<sup>st</sup> to Pennsylvania, South on Pennsylvania to the North Shore of White River, Southwest along the shore to a line which is the projection North of Boulevard Place, South from there to the Water Company Canal, Southwest along the North Shore of the canal to 38<sup>th</sup> St., West to Township Line Rd., North along the Western Township line to 86<sup>th</sup>.

**DISTRICT II BOUNDARY LINES:** Beginning at 96<sup>th</sup> St., and Township Line Road, South to 86<sup>th</sup> St., West on 86<sup>th</sup> to Harcourt Rd. South on Harcourt to 79<sup>th</sup> St., East on 79<sup>th</sup> to Spring Mill Rd., South on Spring Mill to 75<sup>th</sup> St., East on 75<sup>th</sup> to College Ave., South on College to 71<sup>st</sup> St., Southeast along the old City of Indianapolis boundary line to Westfield Blvd., South on Westfield to the White River, along the North Shore of White River to 64<sup>th</sup> St., projected West, along that projected line to 64<sup>th</sup> St., continuing to Evanston, South on Evanston to Broad Ripple Ave., East on Broad Ripple to Burlington, North on Burlington to McKinley St., West to Keystone Ave., North on Keystone to 71<sup>st</sup> Str., East on 71<sup>st</sup> to Dean Rd., North on Dean Rd. to 82<sup>nd</sup> St., and continuing Northwest as 82<sup>nd</sup> becomes 86<sup>th</sup> St., to Manderly, North on Manderly to 91<sup>st</sup> St., West on 91<sup>st</sup> to Kerwood, North on Kerwood (extended) to 96<sup>th</sup> St., West on 96<sup>th</sup> to Township Line Rd.

**DISTRICT III BOUNDARY LINES:** Beginning at Kerwood (extended) and 96<sup>th</sup> St., South on Kerwood to 91<sup>st</sup>., East on 91<sup>st</sup> to Manderly, South on Manderly to 86<sup>th</sup> St., East on 86<sup>th</sup> and Southeast as it becomes 82<sup>nd</sup> to Dean Rd., South on Dean Rd., to 71<sup>st</sup> St., West on 71<sup>st</sup> to Keystone Ave., South on Keystone to McKinley St., (extended east), along that line to Tacoma Ave., South on Tacoma to 62<sup>nd</sup> St., East on 62<sup>nd</sup> to Rural St., South on Rural to Kessler Blvd., East on Kessler to the Norfolk and Western railroad tracks, Southwest along the tracks to Keystone Ave., South on Keystone to 46<sup>th</sup> St., East on 46<sup>th</sup> to Penwood Dr., North on Penwood to Willowbrook Pkwy., East on Willowbrook as it becomes 47<sup>th</sup> St., to Fall Creek Pkwy. N. Dr. Southwest on Fall Creek to 46<sup>th</sup> St., East on the old City of Indianapolis boundary line and East on 46<sup>th</sup> to Sherman, South on Sherman to 42<sup>nd</sup> St., East on 42<sup>nd</sup> to Berkshire Dr., North on Berkshire to Devon Dr., East on Devon to Emerson Ave., North on Emerson to Emerson Way, North on Emerson Way to Fall Creek Pkwy. N. Dr., East on Fall Creek to the East Township line, along the Township line to 62<sup>nd</sup> St., East on 62<sup>nd</sup> (extended) to the East line of the Township, North on that line to 96<sup>th</sup> St., West on the North Line of the Township to the beginning.
