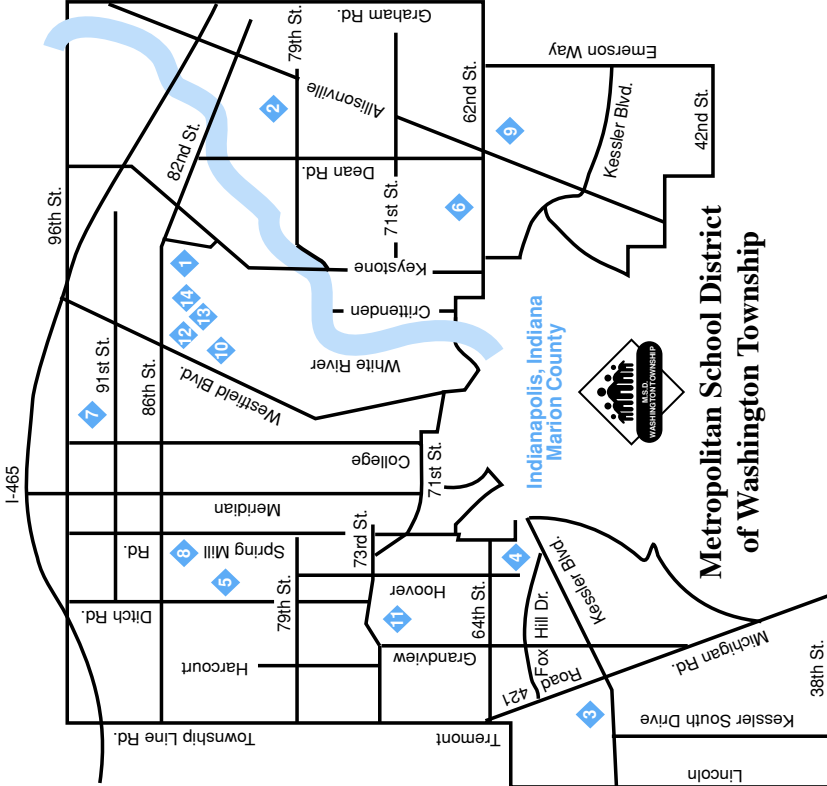

3D is everywhere these days, most commonly in feature films and television. However, new applications and technology are allowing 3D to also be “printed”, opening up possibilities of creative expression, manufacturing and even science and medicine.

This course will introduce the concept of creating 3D objects using computer applications. Students will receive instruction on the navigation of 3D space in a computer application, how to use basic toolsets, how to sculpt and manipulate the virtual meshes and ultimately complete their own model that will be printed on a 3D printer.

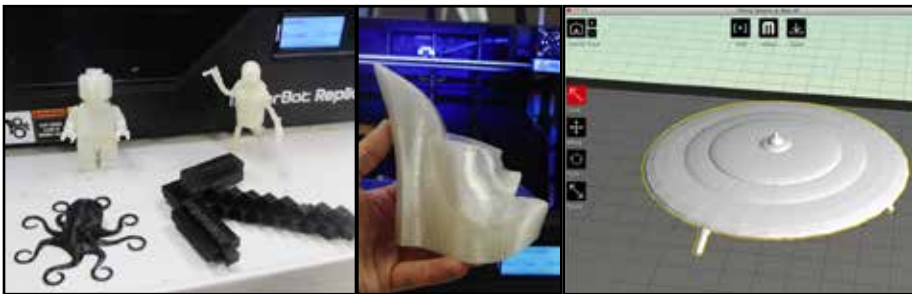

Music Recording and Mixing Workshop

Learn the basics of recording and mixing music in the audio studios of J. Everett Light Career Center, home of WJEL Radio.

If you play guitar, drums, piano or any instrument, love to sing or rap and desire to create your own music, this workshop will be perfect for you.

Elementary and Middle School students will learn tracking and mixing techniques, along with MIDI recording and editing. High School student will have the same choices or they may bring in the whole band for recording sessions in the studios. You'll have access to 8 project studios, 2 recording studios and all the gear you need to create your songs. I-Mac computers in each studio feature Pro Tools, GarageBand, and Reason digital audio software. Each studio has Midi capability.

Pharmacy Technician Course

This comprehensive 40-hour course prepares you to enter the pharmacy field in hospitals, home infusion pharmacies or community pharmacies as a technician under a registered pharmacist's supervision. Course content focuses on learning medical terminology specific to the pharmacy, reading and interpreting prescriptions and defining drugs by generic and brand names. You'll also learn dosage calculations, IV flow rates, drug compounding and dose conversions. Dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control, billing and reimbursement also are discussed. Prerequisites: You must be 18 or older, have a high school diploma/GED and have no felony convictions. This course is approved by the Indiana State Pharmacy Board. Art classes, taught by experienced North Central art teachers, will offer high school students with a serious interest in art, a chance to work in a conceptual approach.

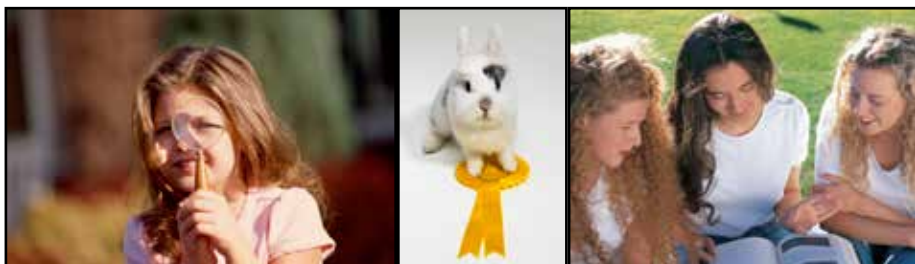
