

Master Facilities Committee Meeting 2/10/2016 Feedback (Questions, Comments, Suggestions)

Questions:

Q: Is redistricting (even a suggestion at a basic level) any part of the overall campaign of "selling" the referendum to the stakeholders? (I'm thinking of the John Strange/Allisonville talks).

A: Once we have a project, we will have a thoughtful process for community input regarding needs for redistricting.

Q: Dr. Woodson's answer about our relationships with several apartment complexes was appreciated, but is there one that stands out that might work with us to be the example that was alluded to?

A: We have several designated apartment complexes that we have relationships with in regards to offering tutoring, summer feeding program, etc.

Q: Could the district leadership come up with 2-3 standardized questions in the next few days we could use to ask our neighbors and community members? This would help eliminate some (not all) bias and help assess the sample size.

A: Yes, several resources will be made available to share with the community.
