

Operations Updates

• The MSDWT Maintenance Department completed approximately 500 work orders this summer! Work orders included painting, plumbing, flooring, electrical, carpentry, maintenance and repair at all of our schools.

District signage was updated to reflect

- new policies regarding district indoor and outdoor physical fitness facilities -Under Indiana law, a school is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in physical fitness activities at this location if the death or injury results from the inherent risks of the physical fitness activity. Inherent risks of physical fitness activities include risks of injury inherent in exercise, the nature of a sport, the use of exercise equipment, or the use of a facility provided by a school. Inherent risks also include the potential that you may act in a negligent manner that may contribute to your injury or death, or that other participants may act in a manner that may result in injury or death to you. You are assuming the risk of participating in this physical fitness activity.
- A system-wide drinking water management protocol was implemented throughout the entire district - As part of its system-wide improvements to the school district's buildings, MSD of Washington Township has implemented a drinking water management protocol. In consultation with environmental professionals, we have implemented the following steps to insure the safety of our drinking water supply for all users. In order to avoid any erroneous assumptions, the School District is providing this public notice that the use of lab, classroom or other sinks for drinking water purposes is prohibited. These sinks may come in contact with chemicals, paint or other disposable matters which may be of the nature that should not be ingested. Limiting drinking water use to fountains, which are available in all school buildings, will allow the School District to best manage and maintain the safety of its drinking water supply.
