### Welcome Back!

Child Nutrition has been very busy over the summer planning for a new and exciting school year. Things will be a little different this year as we put some new and old procedures in place so we can nourish your students as efficiently as possible.

Washington Township's Child Nutrition Department operates under the USDA federally funded National School Breakfast and Lunch Programs to provide nutritious and appealing meals for students. A benefit of these programs is the ability to provide free or reduced-price meals and textbook assistance to families who are eligible according to the federal income guidelines. Since the emergency pandemic funding has not been extended for the 2022-2023 school year, meals will be charged based on the student's approved eligibility.

If you need assistance covering the cost of school meals, a meal benefit application will need to be completed and approved. If you were notified that your student was 'directly certified' prior to the start of school you do not need to complete an application for assistance.

Student Breakfast Prices: \$1.50 (reduced \$0.00)

Student Lunch Prices: Elementary \$ 2.50 (reduced \$0.40); Secondary \$2.65 (reduced \$0.40)

Milk Only (regardless of eligibility): \$0.50

### LUNCH LINES ARE CASHLESS!

All school cafeterias use a pre-pay meal account system. Washington Township Child Nutrition Services encourages parents/guardians to set up a FREE online MyPaymentsPlus account to pay for meals and to view student's meal purchase history. MyPaymentsPlus is the preferred method when submitting funds for student meals.

If you wish to send cash or check please place the money in an envelope marked clearly with your student's name, their ID#, \$ amount and the check number. Elementary students can turn the envelope into their cafeteria or their classroom teacher. Middle and High School students can place their completed envelope in the cash boxes located outside their cafeteria. Deposits made before 10 am will be in their account for lunch.

If cash is provided in the lunch line for purchases, change will not be given back but deposited into the student's meal account for later use.

### Student ID Cards

A Student ID Card is used at the Point of Sale at ALL schools because the following are very important to us:

Keeping students moving through the line so they have more time to eat and interact with friends.

Being alerted for any known food allergies your student may have.

Keeping the student's eligibility status private.

Documenting that the student received a meal.

At check out students scan their ID card to access their meal account. Please remind them to have it.

**Charge Policy:** Per USDA guidelines, MSDWT is not allowed to incur bad debt from unpaid meal charges. We recognize that there are circumstances that may cause a student to not have money on their account. ## Need Meal Assistance and Other Educational Benefits Such as Textbooks?

Free and Reduced Price Meals are available to families who qualify. A **new application must be completed every school year** beginning July 20, 2022, **unless you are otherwise notified that your student has been pre-approved through Direct Certification.** Only one (1) Free or Reduced Meal application is required per family. Incomplete applications **cannot** be approved, so please fill out all required information. If your family chooses to apply, there are **four** ways to do so:

1. Complete an application online for quick processing. Go to <http://caf .msdt.k12.in.us>. Results in 48 hours.
2. Print a paper application and instructions. Go online to [www.msdt.k12.in.us](http://www.msdt.k12.in.us), click Child Nutrition/Fork & Knife Icon, click Download Meal Application in English or Spanish and print to complete.
3. Pick up a paper application and instructions at any school or the H. Dean Evans Community & Education Center.
4. Call the Child Nutrition office at 317-205-3332, extension 77209 and request that one be mailed to you.

All completed paper applications can be returned to any school office, cafeteria or mailed to the H. Dean Evans Community & Education Center, Attention: Child Nutrition, Free and Reduced, 8550 Woodfield Crossing Blvd, Indianapolis, IN 46240. Applications can be faxed to 317-205-3385. You will be notified by phone, mail or email of your student's status within 10 working days of being processed. For questions regarding status, please call your school.

Factors considered in the application process are **household size** and **total household** gross income. **HOUSEHOLD SIZE** is considered all persons, related or unrelated, including parents, children and grandparents who live in your home and share living expenses. The **TOTAL HOUSEHOLD GROSS INCOME** is the income each household member received last month **before** taxes. This includes wages, social security, pension, unemployment, welfare, child support, alimony, and any other cash income. Other determining factors include being a recipient of SNAP (Food Stamps), TANF, FDPIR or Medicaid. **All case numbers will be verified before processing.** Foster children are eligible for free meals regardless of household income but must complete an application for processing.

**Allergies:** Students with allergies are permitted food substitutions only when a medical statement from a doctor is on file with the school. Visit Child Nutrition webpage for more information.
