



PARENT AND STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES REGARDING SEIZURES AT SCHOOL

Seizures are a complex and ever-changing diagnosis that requires parents, students, school nurses, and school employees to be continually prepared. To ensure safety and optimal learning environment for student with seizures, the school provides the following:

- General Training emailed to all teachers each semester.
- Specific training emails to teachers with students with seizures each semester.
- In person training to primary teachers of elementary students or students with special needs that have seizures.
- Yearly training for all school nurses.
- Quick Reference Emergency Plan given to transportation yearly.
- Volunteer Health Aid (VHA) training each year to school employees who are willing to assist with students with seizures.
- Additional training as deemed necessary by the district nurse.
- VHA or school nurse at all school sponsored after school activities on school campus unless the parent chooses to attend the activity.

To properly care for your student and to promote healthy life skills, we ask that you and your student adhere to the following:

- Provide a Seizure Action Plan yearly prior to the beginning of school.
- Provide all emergency supplies (determined by Action Plan).
- **Carry Emergency medication at all after school activities/field trips (after hours) as the medication in the clinic will not be available to the student at those times.**
- Sign all required forms for students to possess and self-administer medication or treatment while at school.
- Review and sign the Individualized Health Plan (IHP).
- Attend a medical conference each year with a school nurse to review the IHP and provide emergency medication.

I have reviewed the above school responsibilities and personal responsibilities. I agree to provide the medications needed for my student. I will discuss with my student the importance of always having emergency supplies available on him/her/themselves.
